My dear parishioners of St. Joseph and Malia Puka O Kalani:

In the month of June we had two visitors from India: Mother Mary Thadavanal and Sr. Mary Sebastian. They had come to study the possibility of joining the ministry at our Hilo Roman Catholic Community. They see great possibilities here and I believe you liked them. Mother Mary is sending two sisters to start a convent here in Hilo. They are Sr. Marykutty Mathew and Sr. Ruth Zonunthari. They will be arriving on November 15 at about 1 pm in Hilo Airport.

Rev. Thomas Purayidathil, Ph.D.

Sr. Marykutty holds a Masters Degree in Theology and has worked as Pastoral Assistant in Italy. She is going to be the Superior of the Community as well as the Pastoral Assistant. Our mission statement clearly states we gather as a community to celebrate the Eucharist ... etc. We have to make our Liturgy and prayer life the center of our parish life and her experience will be useful to us and I very much appreciate someone who can assist me in this regard. She will be helping with the Religious Education program as well as youth ministry. Welcome Sr. Marykutty Mathew!

I had asked an Adhoc committee headed by Linda Tolmie to study the possibility of revitalizing our social outreach program. They

came up with some very sound recommendations. They suggested that the Church appoint a full-time social outreach minister who is qualified. I have accepted their suggestion and Sr. Ruth Zonunthari will be filling that position. She holds a Masters degree in Social Work and has some experience working with the rehabilitation of aids-patients and the like. Apart from the food pantry we should open up other social areas where we can help our community. We could work with the OSM and Catholic Charities. We need to develop a bereavement ministry that is sorely lacking in our parish. There are many areas in which we can vitalize our social ministry and Sr. Ruth with your help will be able to do that. Welcome Sr. Ruth!

We are renting a home belonging to Mr. Walter Lucas that will serve as the convent for them. We need to furnish the home and I will be asking your help for that. The Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians are involved in faith formation, schools, youth work, direct evangelization etc. One of the priorities of the Diocese and our parish is the care of the youth. The presence and work of the sisters in our parish community will assist us in realizing that goal. Please pray that this endeavor will be a great success.

# **Sunday Reflection**

#### Fr. John M. Mbinda

#### November 9, 2008: The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

Readings: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12; 1 Cor. 3:9c-11,16-17; John 2:13-22

#### First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

Today's First Reading, an angel of the Lord shows the prophet Ezekiel a stream of life giving water that originates from beneath the temple. The wonderful and super-abundant stream flowing from the temple, transforming arid land into fertile ground, is symbolic of the return to primeval paradise conditions (Genesis 2:10-14). Water signifies great blessings, just as dryness signifies a curse (Ezekiel 26:5, 14).

#### Psalm 46:2-3, 5-6, 8-9

Psalm 46 is a prayer in praise of God whose strength and ever-present nature is compared to the waters of the river that refreshes and sanctifies. "The waters of the river gladden the city of God, the holy dwelling of the most high."

#### Second Reading: 1 Cor. 3:9c-11, 16-17

In the Second Reading, Paul uses one of his favorite metaphors for the Church, God's building, the temple in which God dwells. Paul reminds the Corinthians that they must build on the foundation he laid, "for no one can lay a foundation other than the one that is there, namely, Jesus Christ." In other words, Christ is the unique foundation. The "you" in this text refers to the Corinthian Christian community. It is this Community that is the temple of God wherein the Divine Spirit dwells and enters into the hearts of its members. To desecrate a temple is a heinous crime.

#### Gospel: John 2:13-22

The Gospel passage is about Jesus going to the Temple in Jerusalem for the Passover. Immediately on seeing that the temple area (the courtyard) had become like a market place, Jesus sets out to cleanse it. Because of many pilgrims, it was necessary that vendors supply their needs (animals for sacrifice and Jewish half-shekels to pay the Temple tax, as this tax could not be paid in Roman or Greek coins). Unfortunately, this trading gave rise to abuses. That is why Jesus cleanses the Temple, by pushing the traders with a whip to relocate outside the courtyard. In driving out the traders, Jesus makes a claim that angers the religious leaders. "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a market place." The sacredness of the Temple here links with what Paul teaches in the Second Reading.

Japanese Sister School Makes Visit to SJS

Twelve middle and high school students and three staff from Urawa Jitsugyo Gakuen, north of Tokyo, are on an exchange visit to the school until Nov. 13. This is the third time the school has sent students to Hilo, St. Joseph students have been to Japan twice. Urawa Jitsugyo Gakuen is part of the Kunori School System that includes United Hawai` i College in Hilo.

The students participate in a home stay while in Hilo and will accompany their host students to school daily. Host families will also take students to visit various destinations on the Big Island. The school has arranged a visit to Pu`uhonua O Honaunau National Historical Park and Hapuna Beach.

School Principal, Sister Marion Kikukawa, OSF, believes that these sister school visits benefit not only the visiting students but all of our students by expanding everyone's appreciation of international perceptions while building personal relationships. In addition, Urawa students will practice English while St. Joseph students will hone their Japanese language skills.
